

How to start an Argumentative Essay

Understand the structure of an Argumentative Essay:

An argumentative essay is composed of five parts: an introduction, three body paragraphs, and a conclusion. It should include evidence to support claims made in the essay. The introduction should introduce the topic and provide a thesis statement that states your position on the issue being discussed.

Choose a Topic:

Select a topic that interests you and provides two or more sides of an argument. For example, "Should the death penalty be abolished?" Research both Sides of the Argument: Gather evidence from credible sources that represent both sides of the issue. This will help you formulate your arguments and provide support for your claims.

Outline Your Argumentative Essay:

An outline will help you organize your thoughts and determine the order in which you want to present your evidence. Start by writing a thesis statement that states your position on the issue then list two or three reasons why you believe this is true.

Write the Introduction:

Introduce the topic and provide a thesis statement that states your position on the issue being discussed.
